


CLIVE DEREK







AROUND AND ABOUT



TRAMORE



Tramore was not identifiable as a fishing village until the 18th century but by 1746 it could be described as a "pleasant retreat for the citizens of Waterford and others who assemble there for the purposes of the salt water". A map of 1778 shows a scattering of houses, including at least five that still exist.

But, what really set Tramore going was large scale investment in its potential by Bartholomew Rivers, a Waterford Banker. Between 1778 and 1793 he did all he could to popularise it in fashionable circles even going to the extent of building Assembly Rooms. By the 1830's there were two Churches, three Hotels, a Post Office, a Police Barracks and a covered Market Place, the gift of Lord Doneraile.

The neighbourhood of Tramore affords many opportunities for pleasant walks and the town is also a convenient centre for touring the County.


SPORT AND RECREATION:

BATHING from the beach. Other popular places are the Pier, Guillameen Cove and Newtown Cove. GOLF. There is a fine 18-hole Course (1 mile) and in town, two Pitch and Putt Courses. Tramore TENNIS Club is in Love Lane. DANCING. Many of the Hotels have dances or discos throughout the season. BOATING. Boats for fishing and pleasure are often available for hire at the Pier. Horse Racing — TRAMORE RACES are popular events in the Irish Sporting Calendar — especially the mid-August fixture.

WALKS AND POINTS OF INTEREST.

- Along the Promenade and Strand to the Burrows, a succession of sandhills about 1 mile in length, east of the Town.
- Along the Doneraile Walk to Doneraile Cliffs, which running in a southern direction from the Town, border the bay on the west. There are grassy slopes down to the edge of the cliffs, from which fine views are obtained. This walk may be extended to the Metal Man', an iron figure crowning one of the three white pillars on Great Newtown Head. (Brownstown Head, the eastern extremity of the bay, is crowned by two similar white pillars. These landmarks serve to distinguish Tramore Bay from Waterford Harbour, farther east).

AROUND AND ABOUT WATERFORD



The name Waterford is a Viking one and owes its origins to the Norse Vadrefjord — "Weather Haven". The Vikings sailed up the Suir in their long ships at first to plunder and then to colonise.

Their memory is preserved in the best known of Waterford's ancient buildings, Reginald's Tower which dominates the waterfront at the junction of The Mall and The Quay. The tower marks the north-east corner of the Viking triangular city. Underneath the tarmacadam and embedded in the rubble and concrete are the rich remains, very similar to the rich deposits found in Winetavern Street and Wood Quay, Dublin. Originally the tower rose straight out of the water and it has been in turn a Norman Fortress, Royal Residence, a Mint, Arsenal and now a Museum of importance.

There are many buildings of interest including *Christ Church Cathedral* (Church of Ireland) built in 1773 on the site of an earlier Church. *St. Olaf's Church* near the City Hall dates from the 11th century. The "French Church" (or Grey Friars), off the Quay was originally a Franciscan foundation, built in 1240. *The Dominican Priory* (or Blackfriars) in Arundel Square, founded in 1226, was one of the oldest Dominican houses in Ireland. *The Catholic Cathedral* in Barronstrand Street is a fine building on Classic lines, completed in 1796. *St. John's College* (1871) is devoted to the training of students for the priesthood. *Mount Sion School* conducted by the Irish Christian Brothers was the first school of the order, established by the founder Edmund Ignatius Rice, in 1803. *The City Hall* is an imposing though plain fronted building on the Mall. It was erected in 1788. Many items of historic interest are on display in the building.

Waterford is chiefly known as a seaport and industrial city, probably its most widely known product is Waterford Crystal, the manufacture of which declined in the last century, but was revived to become internationally famous.

Always a cultural centre and seat of learning, Waterford has produced many eminent men in literature, the arts, and many other fields of endeavour.

Waterford has good hotel and guesthouse facilities and first class sporting and shopping facilities.



AROUND AND ABOUT DUNMORE EAST



Once a mail packet station, Dunmore East now flourishes in the dual role of fishing port and holiday resort. As the former it now ranks second only to Killybegs having been improved and updated about 16 years ago. Its lovely strand and cliff formations, together with the high quality of its thatched houses and its hotels, attract the discerning visitor. It is also a notable yachting centre.

The area gave its name to a 13th century Norman Manor. This period is marked by the remains of a circular tower that may have been a smaller version of Reginald's Tower in Waterford and the Hook Tower (Lighthouse) in Co. Wexford.

Dunmore's great leap forward was marked by the construction of the mail packet harbour. It was begun in 1824 for the mail/passenger service to and from Milford Haven. About the same time steamships replaced the sailing vessels. In 1835 the service was transferred to Waterford.

Two buildings that attract the eye in Dunmore are the Mercy Convent and the Haven Hotel. The former was built as a hotel in the days of the mail steamers. The Haven Hotel was the "Villa Marina" built in the 1860's by David Malcomson of the famous cotton-spinning and ship-building firm. The Fisherman's Hall, nearby, was the gift of his family.

To the north of Dunmore is Creadon Head and in the south the high promonitory known as "Black Knob", beneath which is "Merlin's Cave". In the extreme south of the penninsula is Swine's Head, and facing the village are the conspicuous Hook Head and its Lighthouse on the Wexford side of Waterford Harbour.

Dunmore East is an ideal base for many types of sport — sailing, fishing, pony-trekking, golf, etc. and is the headquarters of the Waterford Harbour Sailing Club who hold a regatta annually.
