## Week ending Sunday 5th August 1984

Most of Merseyside's interest this week has been centred on The Tall Ships - hence the lack of detail in these notes.

RADIO MERSEYWAVES 1179kHz & 94.8MHz: 23, Birnam Road, Poulton, Wallasey, Merseyside L44 9AY.

The station signed on at 6pm on Sunday with 6pm-8pm Bert Williams; 8pm9pm Tina Christian; 9pm-11pm Paul Jay: The station appear to have closed down shortly after
11pm. Tina Christian is Tania Cannon under a new name, and now operating extended times.

RADIO ELENORE 1179kHz: 16, Stockbridge Street, Anfield, Liverpool L5 6PB.

The station seems to have been on the air from llam to Midnight on Friday, but the DJ line-up was not noted. Saturday operation seems to have followed the normal schedule and I understand that the station was to have dome another outside broadcast from the crowds watching the Tall Ships, but this was not heard. Sunday schedule also seems to have been much as normal, with the station handing over to Radio Merseywaves at 6pm. The FM signal has not been noted again this weekend.

CENTRAL RADIO INTERNATIONAL 1386kHz: 18, Glynne Street, Orrell, Bootle, Merseyside L20 6DF.

This station were not heard all week, but re-appeared on the air on Saturday, when schedule appears to have been llam to 9pm. Prior to llam the station seems to have been "testing" with continuous music. They were also announcing a new "mystery" DJ who was not heard. Although the station were noted until 11:30am on Sunday, the schedule seems to have been 10am to 9pm, with new DJ, Tony Jones, being heard during the afternoon.

The station are still announcing their "Night-out", to be held at The Oakfield Hotel, Heath Road, Anfield on 29th April.

CHANNEL FIVE 1242kHz: 23, Rice Hey Road, Egremont, Wallasey, Merseyside L44 ODX.

The station now seems to have settled down its "Sundays only" schedule, with all the regular DJs doing 1½ hours each. Although the earlier of the programmes were not heard, the line-up seems to have been the same as last week with the station closing-down at 10:30pm.

RADIO ATLANTIS 936kHz: 150, Rake Lane, Wallasey, Merseyside L45 lJW.

The station appear to have operated normally, with close-down at 9pm. Heard on Sunday were Neil Frazer, Steve Bishop, Rick Dane, Tony Hayes, and Roy Stannier. Steve Bishop then closed the station down at 9pm. The FM outlet has not been noted again this weekend, although some of the DJs have been announcing it. Weekday schedule is still not known.

The station closed down at 7pm on Monday night in order side L45 8HX to allow the DJs to attend the "14s to 18s" Night-out. Programming throughout the rest of the week has not been noted, although the station seems to have been on the air for all of its scheduled hours. Andy Sloan, who "stood-in" at weekends recently for those on holiday, seems to be one of the 'early-morning' DJs. The station is now announcing "20 hours per day, 7 days per week", which sounds just about right with monitoring observations. They are currently announcing their latest "18 and Over" Night-out. This will take place at MA BAKER's NIGHT CLUB, Conway Street, Birkenhead, from 8pm to Midnight on Monday 27th August. Entertainment seems to be the usual for the station..
